The third study was developed with homeless people on the streets of Medellin, Colombia, it looks into the culture and the identity of this population. According to article writers, the main conclusions were that family problems, lack of affection, forced displacement, and loss of family, as well as, feelings of loneliness, abandonment, and low self-esteem led to choosing life on the streets.
