Presentation

The Catholic University Luis Amigó was founded in 1984 by the Community of the Capuchin Tertiaries, inspired by the educational work of Luis Amigó. With more than 40 years of history, it has become a higher education institution committed to comprehensive education, inclusion, and social transformation.

The University's mission is rooted in the fundamental requirement of developing educational and training processes within a high-quality framework, contributing to the development and construction of the country. This is achieved through its core functions of teaching, research, outreach, well-

Academic *Exchanges*

Domestic and international students can participate in a semester exchange program at Luis Amigó Catholic University **through an agreement in place with the institution, which is presented by the Office of International Relations.**

The home university must apply for its students to participate in the exchange program within the established application dates:

February 15 to May 15 of each year,
for exchanges in the second semester
(July to November).

August 15 to November 15 of each year,
for exchanges in the first semester
(January to July).

Application Requirements

for domestic or foreign students are as follows:

- Visiting student application form (with photo).
- Letter of endorsement from the home university.
- Photocopy of passport or citizenship card.
- Curriculum vitae or resume.
- International medical insurance or EPS membership (for Colombian students).

(All foreign students must have international medical insurance that covers medical expenses, pharmaceuticals, hospitalization, transportation, and repatriation of remains. Coverage must begin upon arrival in Colombia and continue until the student's return to their country of origin).

- Transcript of grades for semesters completed to date.

Academic Information

Language of instruction:

Mainly Spanish and English for the Bachelor's Degree in Foreign Languages with an emphasis on English.

Requerimientos del idioma:

B1 for non-Spanish-speaking students. Proof of Spanish proficiency must be provided.

Students can apply for mobility programs of:

- One semester.
- A full academic year.
- Research stays.
- Short courses.
- Double degree programs

Escala de calificaciones:

From 0.0 (zero) to 5.0 (five); the passing grade for undergraduate studies is 3.0.

Resultados de la postulación:

Acceptance of the nominee as an exchange student will be sent approximately one (1) month after the application deadline.

Academic Calendar

First Semester

It begins the first week of January and ends the last week of May.

Second Semester

It begins the first week of July and ends the last week of November.

Subjects

The selection of courses to be taken during the exchange must be made in coordination with the academic advisor at your home university and/or the program director or head.

Please note that there may be changes to this section depending on availability and schedules.

Immigration Requirements for Entering Colombia

Immigration permit:

If the student belongs to a country that does not require a visa to enter Colombian territory for study purposes for one semester, a **letter of request for permission** will be sent, which must be presented to the immigration authorities upon entering the country.

This permit is generally valid for 90 days. Before the 90 days expire, students must apply for renewal and assume the cost of this.

Visa Application Process:

Students who require a visa or whose stay exceeds 180 days must apply for a visa in accordance with the instructions of the Colombian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. In addition, they must apply for a foreigner's identity card, for which the student must also bear the associated costs.

Means of Transportation

The city has several public and private transportation options, which are as follows

Metro System

Metro line B (San Javier – San Antonio) it has two stations that you can get, Suramericana and Estadio, which are very close to the university, about a 6-minute walk away. If you get off at the Suramericana station, you can take the integrated metro route 253, which will drop you off right at the university entrance.

"The Metro System has the *Civic card* as mean of payment. This is a rechargeable electronic ticket that is required to use the Metro network."

Buses

Route 042: Prado – Moravia – Carlos E. Restrepo. For those coming from north-central Medellín.

Route 193: Laureles – Conquistadores – Parque Berrío. Ideal if you are coming from Laureles or Estadio.

Route 201: La América – Carlos E. – Minorista. From the west (San Juan, La América).

Route 251B: Robledo – Carlos E. – Downtown. Connects Robledo with downtown and the university.

Route 284: Castilla – Tejero – the Juanes Park – Carlos E. Useful if you are coming from Castilla or surrounding areas.

Discover *Medellín*



Arví Park

Located in the district of Santa Elena, this ecological park is perfect for ecotourism. It can be reached by cable car from the Santo Domingo station, offering panoramic views of the city.



Museum of Antioquia

Located in downtown Medellín, across from Plaza Botero, this museum is a cultural landmark with an impressive art collection, including works by Fernando Botero.



El Castillo Mu

Located in El Poblado, this Gothic castle houses a collection of art and antiques. Its architecture transports visitors to another era.



Atanasio Girardot Sports Complex

Located in Comuna 11, Laureles, this stadium is the epicenter of soccer in Medellín and hosts sporting events and concerts. Atlético Nacional and Independiente Medellín play here.

Palace of Culture Rafael Uribe Uribe

Right in the heart of Medellín, next to Plaza Botero, this iconic neo-Gothic building is home to cultural activities and exhibitions. Its history and design make it a must-see attraction.



Pueblito Paisa

At the top of 'el cerro Nutibara', near downtown Medellín, this tourist site offers a replica of an Antioquian village and panoramic views of the city.

Botanical Garden

Located in the northern part of the city, near the Universidad metro station, this green oasis features a butterfly garden, native flora, and the iconic Orquideorama.

Museum

At the top of 'el cerro Nutibara', this medieval museum houses a collection of Antioquian gardens and artifacts, and is a must-see attraction for visitors to Medellín.
